Statics xhtml/css web page

A static web page has the content (text and images) stored in one file, and will be displayed as it was designed or last edited. A static page can contain dynamic elements where the content of that element is pulled from a database. Content editors (see below) allow you to edit text and images on static page.

Ideal for a brochure style websites where content is not changed or infrequently changed. Add a content editor to easily update the text on your site, news, events, specials, etc.

Dynamic xhtml/css web page

A dynamic web page stores its content in databases. When the site is visited, the content is pulled from the databases and assembled into a webpage. A content management system (see below) is used to manage the site.

Ideal for websites that require expandability, regular content additions or edits, e-commerce, or other custom applications.

A dynamic site with a full featured CMS gives you complete control of your website.

Content Management System

A content management system (CMS) is software used to manage a website. A full featured CMS will completely manage your website, including adding or removing pages, editing text and photos, managing users and advertisements, inventories, etc. Joomla CMS requires almost no technical skill or knowledge to manage.

Content Editor

A easy to use, web based content editor that allows you to edit the text, documents, and images on your site. Sometime refer to as Ultra Lite CMS. This system is not expandable by the user (you cannot add or remove pages).

Joomla

Joomla is an award-winning content management system (CMS), which enables you to build Web sites and powerful online applications. Many aspects, including its ease-of-use and extensibility, have made Joomla the most popular Web site software available. Best of all, Joomla is an open source solution that is freely available to everyone.
